
Missions Assessment Profile

MAP your church's global outreach priorities.



How to Use This Profile

Does your church want to grow in global ministry? Where are you now, where might you go, and where do you start? This tool was developed to help church leaders asking those questions. Use it to assess your progress in engaging (and engaging your whole church) in global outreach.

A Diagnostic Tool

The MAP is designed to help you identify, articulate, and celebrate your mission priorities, to dream about what might be possible, and to make strategic plans to grow your global outreach effectiveness. It will help you explore both the external dimensions (the deployment of your people and resources into the world) and the internal ones (the development of those people and resources). It's not exhaustive but describes 12 common areas in a church's mission involvement.

Completing the Assessment

This tool is most effective in the hands of two or more leaders from the same church. Working separately, each should indicate his or her perspective on where the church stands in each of the 12 areas.

- 1. Start at the left of each row. For each row, put a checkmark in the box that best describes your church. Try not to skip any of the boxes.
- 2. Compile results and/or share your assessments with one another.
- 3. What patterns do you see? What are the holes? Can you identify the obstacles you face and recognize the opportunities? As a group, discuss both the areas of consensus and areas where your perspectives differ.
- 4. As you listen to one another, ask God to help you discern what He might be showing you and how He might be leading you.

Strategic Planning

As your sense of direction crystallizes, pray and choose an area or two for increased focus during the next year. Set a few clear goals and address what it will take to achieve them. Identify several capable people to provide

leadership in each area. Encourage them, support them, and ask them for regular reports on how efforts are progressing.
